

PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT REMINDERS

TIPSHEET FOR COACHES



1 Always remember...

- You represent WCMHA.
- Hockey is a privilege not a right.
- Negative actions can affect other areas of your life (school, job).
- Respect everyone.

2 Dressing Room Reminders...

- Taking photos / videos / voice recordings is not permitted in the locker room.
- Cellphone can only be used for music but have a plan with your team.
- Everyone has a right to a safe and positive environment.
- Rule to Two 2 adults from staff will be present in the room or just outside the door.
- No violent conduct (including bullying, play fighting, hazing) is permitted at any time.
- Alcohol, tobacco or vaping is not permitted in the dressing room at any time.

3 Social Media Reminders...

- Comments that are inappropriate that are detrimental to a team, to WCMHA, D4, HEO or to an individual will not be tolerated and subject to discipline.
- When using social media always conduct yourself in a professional manner.
- Refrain from divulging confidential information or team related information.
- Use your best judgment, pause before sending or posting. Once it is posted it lives there forever.
- You are solely responsible for your comments.
- You are subject to disciplinary action if you divulge personal information regarding another person, post negative or derogatory comments, use social media for any form of

- bullying or harassment, intimidate or make threatening remarks, post photos/videos regarding any behaviour deemed inappropriate.

4 Suspension Reminders...

- Negative actions on ice have consequences.
- Some suspensions come with an automatic hearing such as discriminatory slurs, slurs targeting green armband officials, deliberate injury penalties, physical abuse of an official, post game altercations.
- For post game penalties (i.e.) anything that happens in the handshake, your coach also gets suspended and must attend a hearing.

What words should I avoid?

- It's important to remember disrespectful words or gestures targeted towards the other opponent or any official will not be tolerated and will result in a suspension.
- There is zero tolerance for words that discriminate against race, culture, gender, physical appearance, or that are sexual or violent and intimidating in nature.

6 Who can I talk to?

- If you are feeling unwelcome or unsafe, please speak to your head coach.
- If you are not comfortable with speaking to your head coach, find another member of the team staff including the manager to speak to.
- WCMHA is here is support you and they can bring your concerns forward to a member of the executive if required.
